

COMENIUS PROJECT

Visit to Cerna Hora
(Czech Republic)

Thursday 10th January 2008

Day totally dedicated to travelling. Problems with our luggage at Prague airport, it wouldn't turn up.

Friday 11th January 2008

We visited the school and attended some English and music lessons. Part of the luggage was found but not all. We had lunch at the school refectory and went for a tour of Cerna Hora's surrounding area, visiting Moravian caves and enjoying the snow-covered landscape.

Saturday 12th January 2008

Breakfast with some of the teachers participating in the project.

Two students per each participating country translated to all of the participating countries' languages the recipes for the cookery book that will include them all. After that, we had a meeting with the purpose of evaluating the project.

1. Presentation of the different themes of the project for each one of the participating schools:
 - a) The project coordinator, Agni Bolder –Germany- presents the different activities. Some of them, about globalization, will be dealt with through a view on fast-food, cowboys and music.
 - b) The teacher of the English group explains how the activities proposed in Düren will be faced and carried out.
 - c) The Spanish teacher –Miguel Sánchez, explains the aspect that will be worked at IES Mediterrània. The teacher David Sabater will be in charge of creating a CD with music from the different countries participating in the project in the context of globalization.
 - d) Regarding the Czech group, the teacher Marketta will carry out activities related to the topic of pollution, using newspapers and pictures and cooperating with the Spanish group that will work the topics of pollution, the greenhose effect and global warming. All of it will be exhibited in Düren in the month of June.

2. Ideas for the Düren meeting:

The German teacher invites the rest of teachers to attend the meeting at Düren on the 19th, 20th and 21st of June 2008 and asks for information about the number of students that will go (an average of six per participating country is proposed) and about the technical materials necessary to present the project. They want to organize a macro exhibition of the developed themes together with other new ones.

3. Keeping in touch after the project:

The coordinator asks for some thinking about the convenience of continuing work on the project and of talking about it at the Düren meeting. It would be possible to continue with the same project, look for new points of view or change the topic. The English group suggests travelling in March with some students, but this suggestion is rejected because it would increase expenses. We receive a present from the Czech students: a CD recorded by them with typical songs of their folklore as well as some religious pieces and a little picture

with a flower ornament sewn by the students. We finished the session at 2:00 p.m. taking a picture of the group. In the afternoon we visited the town centre, said good bye to our partners, and left for Prague.

Sunday 13th January 2008

We had an early breakfast in a downtown hotel and we completed our visit of the city and its typical places. We also went shopping and strolled around beautiful places.

We left for the airport, took our connecting flight to Paris and arrived to Valencia at 9:35 p.m. We arrived to Benidorm and the students were returned to their families.
